

Shehzade M.K (Girls) - 1 Gold in Putting the Shot. Avani KV (Girls) - Silver in 1500m and Bronze in 3000m. N Sneha (Girls) - Silver in 3000m.

Basketball Girls Won Silver Medal

The women's Basketball team participated in four matches during the tournament. In the group stage, they played against Mohali and Berhampur, winning 24 - 5, and 17 - 2, respectively. In the semi-finals, they played against Pune and won 24 - 22. However, in the final against Bhopal, they lost 32 - 22, resulting in a second place in the tournament.



Kho-Kho (Girls) - Silver Medal

The Kho-Kho girls' team played four matches in total. In the first match against Pune, the Kho-Kho team won by dismissing all the defenders within the seven-minute time limit, resulting in a "one inning win" with a score of 6-2. Similarly, the team won the second match against Berhampur with a score of 10-3 in one inning. In the semi-final match against TVM, the Kho-Kho team won with a score of 7-4, while in the final match against Mohali, they lost with a score of 8-11, ultimately becoming the runners-up in the tournament.



KABADDI (Boys) - Silver Medal

The men's kabaddi team played in the group stage against IISC, Kolkata, and Mohali. They lost against IISC with a score of 45-38 and won against Kolkata by 33-20. However, they won against Mohali with 38-24. In the semi-finals, they played against TVM and won with a score of 44-30. In the finals, they played against Bhopal and lost 36-42.





Football (Boys) - Silver Medal

The team played five matches in total, starting with a draw against IISER Kolkata with a score of 0-0. The second match against IISER Bhopal also resulted in a draw, with both teams scoring 2 goals each. NISER won the third match against CEBS Mumbai with a score of 9-0. In the fourth match, NISER emerged victorious against IISER Mohali with a score of 2-1 in the semi-final. Despite their valiant efforts, NISER lost from IISER Bhopal in the final match with a score of 0-1, becoming the runners-up in the tournament.



<u>Carom – Silver Medal</u>

The Carom team topped their 5-member pool in the group stage, having secured a total of 9 points. In the semi-final match against IISER Tirupati, the team emerged victorious with a score of 2-1. However, in the final match against IISER Berhampur, the team lost by a score of 2-1, resulting in a second-place finish in the tournament.

Oorna and Seasonwatch organized **Tree Trail: a tree walk during the August Tree Festival**. The August Tree Festival is a nationwide monsoon fest which has multiple interesting challenges for everyone to compete for. During this walk, students learned about plants, seasons and how the two are linked.

- Student talk by Ashlesh Pattnaik



The soft copies of bird, spider and tree field guides were released on 25th october 2022. Around 50 people worked together for 10 months to give rise to these beautiful field guides.




-Prerana 2022 - World Children's day

Drama and Music Club


- 1. Independence day celebration: DMC organized the annual National anthem choir and cultural program on the eve of India's 76th Independence day in the presence of respected dignitaries, and members of NISER.
- 2. A weekly musical session with students: DMC initiated a "weekend jamming session" series on 20th September 2022, where every Saturday, students gathered in the music room for a stipulated time (usually for an hour) as per convenience and one of the members talked about any topic related to music followed by a discussions and jamming session. These sessions were mainly initiated to encourage the keen enthusiasts of Music in NISER, who are eager to learn the basic technical parts of the music and develop their taste in this art.
- 3. Koffee with Kishore: DMC organized the annual much-awaited koffee with Kishore on 3rd September 2022, to commemorate the contributions of the legendary-star, all-rounder artist, Kishore Kumar Ji.
- 4. Inter-IISER Cultural Meet: Members of DMC represented NISER in the annual IICM that was hosted by IISER Pune, from 27th to 29th of December. NISER showed its brilliance in the various music and drama related events. Our drama performed an award-winning piece named "FALAK" which won critical acclaim for its powerful storytelling and compelling performance. The students also showed much appreciation for their performance in the music events namely, Battle of bands (A competition among bands from all IISERs, IISc, NISER and CEBS), Mehfil (A classical battle among the institutions showing their prowess in all forms of Indian classical music), Solo/Duet singing (Teams with maximum of 2 members each, performed their musical collabs in varied genres).
- 5. DMC also organized music and drama events in NISER's first inter-college fest "TVISHA". The club organized Rangamanch (the stage play competition), Dristi (The nukkad-natak event), Battle of bands and Solo/ Duet singing competitions where students from nearby institutes namely, IIT BBSR, Silicon Institute of Technology, IIIT, CV Raman Global University, ITER participated along with our students.
- Meanwhile, NISER's home team (both in music and drama) participated in fests conducted by other colleges, notably Alma fiesta by IIT Bhubaneswar, KAIRAAN by NLU Odisha.

<u>Quizone</u>

In August 2022, Quizone, the quiz club of NISER, in collaboration with the quiz club of IIT Bhubaneswar, hosted a General quiz in NISER, which saw enthusiastic participation from over a hundred students from both institutions in teams of two students. After an enthralling written round of prelims, a total of eight teams were selected to play in the finals. The Finals were very competitive, with multiple rounds of stimulating quizzing and included some beautifully crafted questions with embedded clues. In the month of October, Quizone also conducted an insta quiz on the official Instagram page of the club, which was a time-limited quiz conducted every day for a fifteen-day period in which the top three fastest correct answers were announced each day. It featured questions from a plethora of topics, from entertainment to history and saw zealous engagement among students and quizzing enthusiasts throughout the event cycle.

The Free Radicals (TFR), the chemistry club of NISER was formally inaugurated by the Director, Prof. Sudhakar Panda at the School of Chemical Sciences (SCS) Meet, 19th April, 2022. After its inception, the club has held a series of alumni talks, student talks, and chemistry-themed activities to invigorate the passion for the subject beyond the classroom. Along with that, outreach activities were held to popularize science among school students and the general public.

Outreach Activities:

1. Prerana 2022 (19th November, 2022)

Prerana 2022 was an expository outreach program for the children of NISER's general workforce. TFR participated in the event with an exhibitional chemistry session. Several fun chemistry experiments like elephant toothpaste, baking soda rocket, liquid nitrogen freezing, fluorescence demonstrations, and flame tests, were performed in front of the children. After each experiment, the science was explained to the children in a lucid manner. The exhilarating event was enjoyed and well appreciated by the children of different age-groups in the audience.

2. Science Camp 2023 (6th - 7th April, 2023)

TFR was involved in teaching high-school students about real-life applications of chemistry. Forensic chemistry was chosen to be the matter of exposition and students were given a case study of a murder case. The theory behind the chemical tests they would perform to solve the case was explained. The students were grouped to attempt the problem, after performing the analytical tests, they explained the cause and culprit of murder.

3. Open Day 2023 (8th April, 2023)

TFR was involved in coordinating the exhibitional chemistry session for the School of Chemical Sciences. Many eye-catching experiments were performed for high school students. The science behind the experiments was explained following which the students expressed their satisfaction in learning new concepts in chemistry.

Departmental Events:

1. SCS Meet 2022 (19th April, 2022)

The club was formally inaugurated at this event. Prof. K.V.R. Chary (Director, IISER Berhampur) and Prof. Swapan K. Ghosh (Distinguished Professor, HBNI) was the Chief Guest and Guest of Honour, respectively. Cultural events were also a part of the proceedings, which were arranged and coordinated by TFR.

2. Aromatte 2022 (22nd October, 2022)

Aromatte 2022 was a Mini-Symposium cum Fresher's Program for M.Sc. Batch '21, Int. Ph.D. '22, and Ph.D. '22 of the School of Chemical Sciences. The morning was devoted to research talks showcasing the work being pursued by the various groups at SCS. The evening was filled with cultural activities, games, and ice-breaking sessions, organized by TFR, for the newly-admitted members of the department.

Other:

1. Khojo to Jaane!!! (18th March, 2023)

Khojo to Jaane!!! was a chemistry-themed treasure hunt organized by TFR during NISER's intercollege fest Tvisha. The event involved locating various interconnected clues littered around the campus by application of the knowledge of chemistry. Only by solving the previous clue, one can proceed to the next and ultimately to the final prize, which made the event a race-against-time of sorts. The event received participation from student groups of science and engineering colleges across Odisha and was received well for its ingenuity and engaging format.

NISER Astronomy Club

- The NISER Astronomy Club (NAC) is devoted to fostering enthusiasm towards astronomy. NAC conducted telescope training sessions for the new joinees of the club in September-October 2022. Students were oriented about the 6-inch equatorial mount telescope and directed to set it up by themselves.
- Mr. Chandan Kumar Sahu and Ms. Dibya Bharati Pradhan were elected as the club representatives of the NISER Astronomy Club for the session 2022-23. They functioned as the contact point of NAC for the club activities and events. Dr. Tuhin Ghosh (SPS), Dr. Luke Chamandy (SPS), Dr. <u>Liton Majumdar</u>(SEPS), and Dr. Jayesh Goyal (SEPS) took the responsibility of being the faculties-in-charge of NAC. They provided support and guidance for the functioning of the club.
- 3. An observation session for the partial solar eclipse on October 25, 2022, and lunar eclipse on November 8 was organized for all members of NISER by NAC, where students, faculties and their family members witnessed the events with binoculars and telescopes while breaking the myths associated with eclipses.
- 4. NAC trained junior members to handle the 8-inch equatorial mount telescope and take photographs of Jupiter and its moons using a CMOS camera. This was a three-week observation run conducted in November 2022, led by Vasanth Kashyap (4th year Int. MSc.) to study the revolution period of Jupiter and its moons, calculate the mass of Jupiter and their orbital synchronization using Kepler's laws of planetary motion.
- On the occasion of Children's Day, NAC conducted an interactive session with school children followed by a demonstration of telescopes, led by Srusti Sampanna (2nd year Int. MSc.).
- 6. In association with the NISER Outreach Committee, NAC hosted a session for visiting teachers and professors from various institutes in November 2022.
- NAC launched the 4th edition of its in-house magazine 'Kshitij' in December 2022, which is the first and longest student-led magazine of NISER. In this edition, content calls were also made to students of other national science institutes, and entries from IISER Pune and IISER Thiruvananthapuram were published.
- 8. NAC organized two events in the inter-college fest TVISHA organized in March 2023, namely ANTARIKSH Astronomy Quiz and GAGAN Astrophotography Contest supervised by Abhinav Roy (3rd year Int. MSc.) and Aheesh Hegde (4th year Int. MSc.). Members from different institutes participated in the events. Trophies and cash prizes worth 12K ere awarded to the winners of the events.
- NAC organized interaction sessions with students of various schools and motivated them towards astronomy, astrophysics and space science on the occasion of Open day in April 2022. NAC demonstrated the appearance of a black hole in space and explained the physics behind the phenomena.
- 10. The club frequently conducts observation sessions and talks on astrophysics and cosmology for all residents of NISER, expanding their knowledge and motivating people towards astronomy and astrophysics. NAC has organized a total of 12 weekend talks between August 2022 and April 2023.


Brain Matters Club


The BRAIN MATTERS club hosted 2 talks during the 2022-2023 academic year. These are:
