India and France have taken significant steps to strengthen their partnership in the field of nuclear energy. Dr. Ajit Kumar Mohanty, Secretary of the Department of Atomic Energy(DAE) and Chairman of the Atomic Energy Commission (AEC), and Mr. François Jacq, General Administrator of the French Alternative Energies and Atomic Energy Commission (CEA), have signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) to bolster bilateral collaboration in nuclear energy through the Global Centre for Nuclear Energy Partnership (GCNEP).

The Global Centre for Nuclear Energy Partnership (GCNEP) is a significant initiative established by the Government of India to promote international collaboration in nuclear energy research and development. Located in Kheri-Jasaur, near Bahadurgarh in Haryana, GCNEP was approved in September 2010 and is the sixth research and development unit under the Department of Atomic Energy (DAE).
